Here is an overview of the key events and updates from this year.

This year, we launched our new tamil/English congregation, expanding our ministry to serve more people from diverse cultural backgrounds. This is a reflection of our church's vision to embrace all nations and cultures, and it has been a blessing to see this congregation take root.

We are also excited to announce that Pastor Min has been accepted as a Minister in Training. This is an important milestone for him, and we look forward to seeing how God will continue to use him in leadership and ministry in our church.

Another significant development has been the successful launch of our first cross-congregation Lifegroup, led by Alex and Nishita. This Lifegroup has been flourishing, and it is encouraging to see members from different congregations coming together in fellowship and spiritual growth.

On the global missions front, we are thrilled that our first mission team to Serbia is preparing to depart in late October. This is an exciting step in our church's outreach efforts. In addition, we have continued to support mission organizations in India, Zimbabwe, and Burkina Faso, reflecting our ongoing commitment to sharing the Gospel beyond our local community.

We are also proud to report the development of our new Care Network, which has been years in the making. Kay, toyin, and Shelagh have done an outstanding job overseeing different areas of pastoral care, ensuring that the needs of our congregation are met. We have also seen the successful launch of area leaders and care cell groups, within the 4 p.m. service, which has fostered deeper community connections.

Our community ministries continue to flourish, with hundreds of meaningful connections made over the past year. One standout initiative is the community garden at our Silverdale Community Centre, which has been a great success, providing both a place of nourishment and a gathering point for local residents.

One of the most exciting highlights of the year is the 14 baptisms we've celebrated so far. Seeing individuals make this public declaration of their faith is truly a blessing, and we are encouraged by others who are currently preparing to be baptized.

At the start of the year, we set a goal to extend both Sunday services that meet in the Silverdale Church Building, and since May, we have been able to do so. In fact, at times, these extensions have been necessary due to the growth of our congregation, which is a wonderful problem to have.

Despite these successes, we have faced several challenges this year. Rising costs due to inflation have affected our financial situation, though we are thankful that our offerings have increased. However, we remain slightly short of our annual budget by less than £1 per person per week. With continued giving and faithful stewardship, we are hopeful we can meet our financial goals.

Additionally, some members of our congregation have reached a stage in life where health and age have led them to step down from their ministry roles. We are now looking for ways to integrate newer members of our church community into these roles, ensuring that our ministries continue to thrive with fresh energy and leadership.








Income

Why do we need a new local constitution?

Elim gives us flexibility in the appointing of Deacons and Elders in the local Church. This means that we do this in a systematic, orderly and accountable way.

Local Constitution being put forward summary

Nomination for Eldership shall be made by the Pastor(s) and existing Elders and confirmed with a membership vote. Each elder will be voted on for intervals of no more than 5 years, however, they can be reappointed after that time.

Deacons are appointed by the Pastor(s) and Elders to carry out specific roles. Each deacon will be appointed for intervals of no more than 4 years. however, they can be reappointed after that time.

- In addition to strengthening our central hub, we need to also commit to looking at planting churches in underserved areas, especially those areas where people are more than 15 minutes from a charismatic congregation. This endeavor aligns with our mission of sharing our faith with those who lack access to charismatic or Pentecostal church in their area.






the Elim Movement aims to be an international disciple-making movement with strategies for church planting and leadership development in every nation.
